BLOOD SAMPLING VOLUME

One result of improved laboratory testing (e.g., new instrumentation, collection techniques) is smaller volumes of blood required to achieve valid test results.

Often a large number of tests are ordered on a baby/child. The volume of blood indicated for collection on the CareFusion label or requisition/flimsy is the volume required for valid test results. No repeats/dilutions can be done on minimum volumes. Work with provider to see if some labs can be collected on a later day.
