

Sputum Collections

Instructions for Patients

Important Notes:

- It is important that a quality, deep cough specimen is collected to provide accurate results. Specimens should not be saliva only.
- It is suggested to collect an early morning specimen
- Specimens must be collected into a dry sterile container provided by the lab or your physician. Alternative containers may not be used.
- Collect BEFORE starting antibiotic treatment

Directions for Collection:

- 1. First, rinse mouth with tap water to remove food particles and debris
- 2. Breath deeply and cough several times. This should be a deep cough designed to expel mucus material.
- 3. Expectorate (spit) the mucus specimen into the sterile container provided
- 4. Label the container with name, date of birth, date and time of the collection.
- 5. Transport the specimen to the laboratory within 2 hours of collection and within normal business hours of the location selected. *
- 6. Keep the specimen at room temperature. DO NOT refrigerate.

Additional Information for In-Office Collections/ Collections with Provider

- To assure a quality specimen at the time of collection, when possible, collect under direct supervision of a nurse or physician. Follow the same steps listed above for patient collection.
- For AFB cultures, three sputum specimens at 8-24hr intervals (24hrs when possible) and at least one first morning specimen are recommended. An individual order must be submitted for each specimen collected.
